The Challenge of Controlling COVID-19 Mar
02 2020 Providing an account of the policy
response to COVID-19 in England, this book
analyses the political and long-term
systemic factors associated with the
failures to control the first wave of the

Birthplace of the Atomic Bomb Feb 10 2021

The remote Trinity Site--the birthplace of the bomb--was used as a test range for U.S. bombers before the first nuclear device was secretly detonated. After the blast, locals speculated that the flash and rumble were caused by colliding B-29s, while Manhattan Project officials nervously measured high levels of offsite radiation.
